TRACING ECHOES

Mark Francis

Mark Francis creates powerful paintings charged with movement, sound and rhythm, by combining intense sequences of colour that compete within tightly gridded structures. His meticulous handling of paint generates both a sense of order and a restless energy. There is an agitation in his work – a pulse, a vibration – as if the forms and colours are trying to break free, bleed into one another, or shift beyond their boundaries. Francis's longstanding engagement with science provides rich territory for his work, making striking imagery out of the invisible and the imagined. Whilst the feats of technology inform Francis's work, the true marvel remains within the unknown beyond our reach, where the questions are often more interesting than the answers.

For this exhibition Mark Francis presents new paintings, charcoal drawings, and a new Solstice Commission, Listening Field, the first moving image work by the artist.

Entering into the world of moving image has become a new way for me to translate the motion and sound I see and hear within my work. The way each sequence in a painting has a rhythm, how each band reverberates, and how each hue holds more information than we could ever imagine.

This new work will feature as part of Francis' representation of the Republic of San Marino at the 61st Venice Biennale.

Francis is a Northern Irish painter who works and lives in London. He has exhibited across the United Kingdom and worldwide, including at Hugh Lane Municipal Gallery Dublin, Milton Keynes Gallery, City Art Gallery Manchester, and the Royal Academy in the renowned Saatchi exhibition, Sensation. His work appears in numerous collections, including the Tate Gallery, IMMA Ireland, and Arts Council England.

BOY DANCER

Annemarie Ní Chuireann and Niamh McCann

Boy Dancer is a new exhibition emerging from the first collaboration between poet Annemarie Ní Chuireann and visual artist Niamh McCann. Solstice commissioned poem by Ní Chuireann, Boy Dancer weaves together Ní Chuireann's text, with image, and installation by McCann, exploring themes of memory and loss. Boy Dancer acts as a textual wake in response to the loss of Ní Chuireann's stepbrother. Her poetic practice interlaces Irish language, mythology, and folklore with personal narrative and symbolic fauna. McCann's visual response embraces the lyrical qualities of the poem, drawing on imagery of birds and beasts as seers, omens, and witnesses—resounding McCann's allegorical and personal collaborative practice.

The exhibition includes drawings, wall paintings, and expanded conceptual works developed in response to Boy Dancer, offering a powerful meditation on grief and transformation.

*The starlings come, pushing
like an oar, pushing. Things happened.
Things that never should have happened.*

This is Solstice's second commissioned work with Annemarie Ní Chuireann, the first being The Foundling Crib, which was included in her debut publication The Poison Glen (Gallery Press). Solstice has previously worked with Niamh McCann on Just Left of Copernicus (2012) and Someone Decides Hawk or Dove (2023), the latter a recipient of the ART:2023 Decade of Centenaries Open Call Award, supported by the Arts Council and the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media.

ONE BATTLE AFTER ANOTHER

SPRINGSTEEN: DELIVER ME FROM NOWHERE

MARY COUGHLAN

MUSIC

Mary Coughlan's career in music has been one hell-of-a-ride. Often described as the greatest female vocalist that Ireland has ever produced, Coughlan proudly stands alongside some of the world's most iconic jazz singers. She is unique in blending whisky-blurred, smoke-seared, husky notes with the laconic wit of Billie Holiday and Peggy Lee. 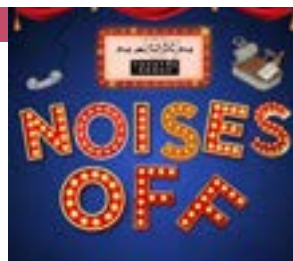

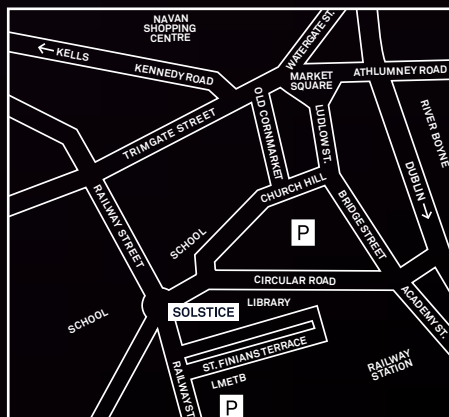
